lots of cheese, biscuits, crisps, chocolate and other nibbles as usual.



mash-up of magic, music, and mirth. The script was sharper than Excalibur itself, packed with puns that left us groaning and laughing in equal measure.




Our newest cast members, Alison Dewar, made a great impact as King Arthur, along with their supportive Oueen Guinevere, Janette Sullivan.

JOHN DOUGLAS FOSTER

John was born on the 27th of December 1933 at Cutting Hill, Shalbourne, the second son of George and Eunice Foster's five children - three boys & two girls. The family moved to Marsh Benham when John was seven years old.

John left Stockcross School in 1947 and went to Lambourn School for a year, this meaning he was one of the first children to remain at school until the age of 15. This is also where he met his future wife Daphne Scaplehorn. On leaving School he began work at Bradfords Farm until he was eighteen before then getting his 'call-up' papers for National Service. He did his training at Alder-

shot and was posted abroad to Benghazi for twenty-one months.

After he retired John decided to restore a tractor. He started with a Fordson, which was sold once he had got it up to a high standard. To follow this, he continued his restoration journey with a Nuffield and a Massey Furgeson 135 which he discovered in the stinging nettles on a campsite on Hayling Island. John, Daphne and Georgina would make numerous trips to see Patrick Edwards at his Clanfield farm machinery business to buy parts and paint. These two tractors were eventually sold and are now residing at Harwell.

John had lived a long and ful-filling life. He was dearly loved by his family and was greatly respected by his many neighbors, relatives and friends, particularly here in Stockcross, where he had lived for over sixty years - the first fifty of them being so happily together with Daphne. He will be fondly remembered by all who knew him.

I would also like to thank all the people from the village who attended his funeral and over £ 800 pounds was raised to Newbury cancer care this was Dad's chosen charity that he liked to support he raised over £800 last year for his 90th birthday.
